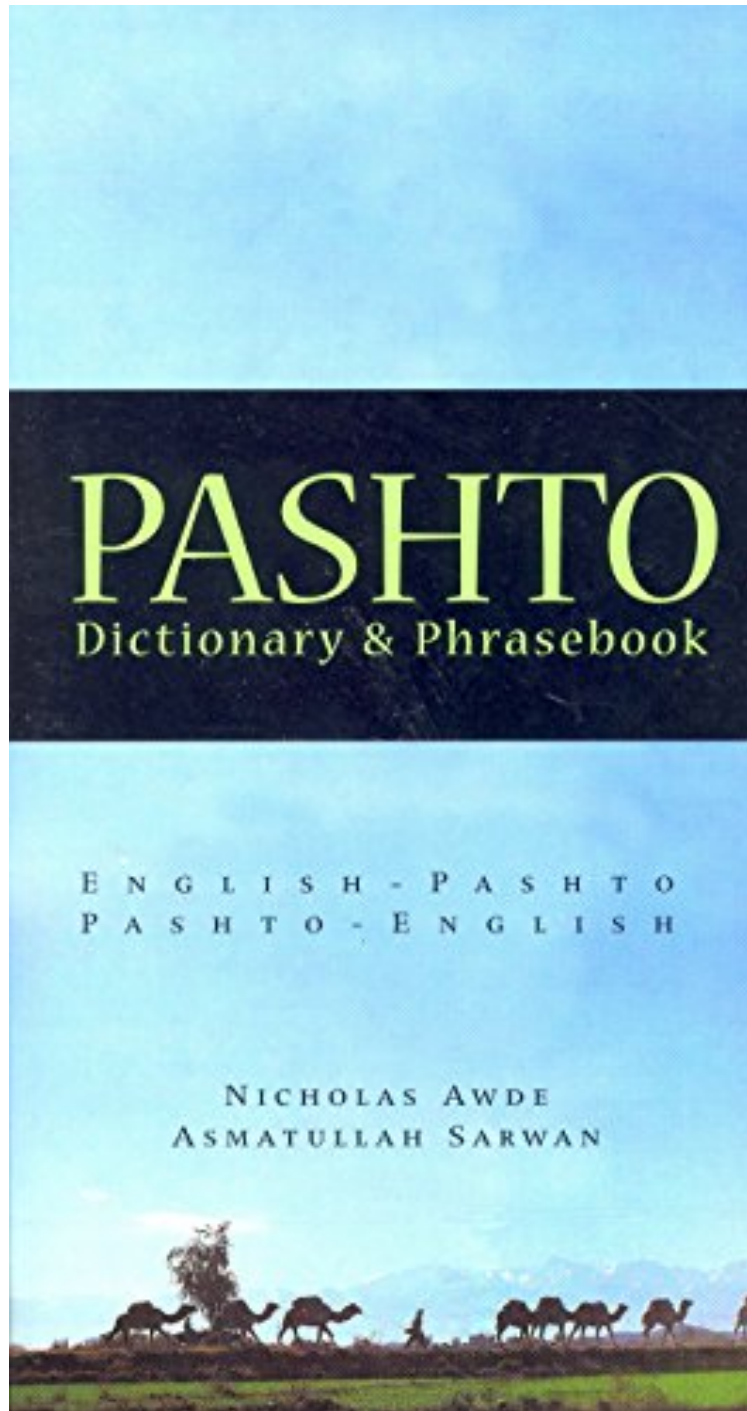

Besides the dictionary, the book has helpful phrases and other miscellaneous handy materials like numbers, Afghan calendar months, week days, family members, etc. I wish the author had published a separate version in which the Pashto was printed in its native script for better pronunciation and learning to those who can read the Arabic script languages.

This book has many of the necessary phrases covered. As you will find in Pashto speaking areas, the language differs greatly from one area or another. You may find that using a phrase in this book will work in one village, but in another you will only get blank stares. The best thing to do is use this book and cross-reference with a translator. You will find that you can get a good grasp on the phrases and then fine tune your ability to use them with correct local phrases.

The dictionary includes the most commonly used words, which is fine and helpful. What it does not include, however, is the Pashto word in actual Pashto script. The English word is included, as well as the phonetic version of the Pashto equivalent but no Pashto word written as a Pashto speaker would write it. For those of us trying to learn not only to speak Pashto but to write the language as well, this is a major deficiency of the dictionary.

Pashto, also known as Pakhto, Pakhtu, or Pushto, is one of the official languages of Afghanistan and is also spoken in the neighboring Northwest Frontier Province of Pakistan. This two-way dictionary and travel oriented phrasebook is an essential communication tool, particularly in the more remote Pashto-speaking regions. Features: romanized for English speakers; basic Pashto grammar; practical cultural information; perfect for travelers, businesspersons, and foreign aid workers.
