He overlooks little and describes in detail what the nature of life is like in that area. Not surprisingly, what he reveals is relevant to issues current today, unchanged and perhaps intensified by actions from and to the region by outside nations. Tribal and religious beliefs do not appear to have changed much in the intervening years. Reading the work is a labor, for he uses archaic descriptive words and writes with a articulate shorthand, sometimes requiring a re-read to get the sense of his intention. He has a wonderfully good nature towards often difficult situations and a keen sense of the absurd which he express's with a humorous yet discerning eye.
