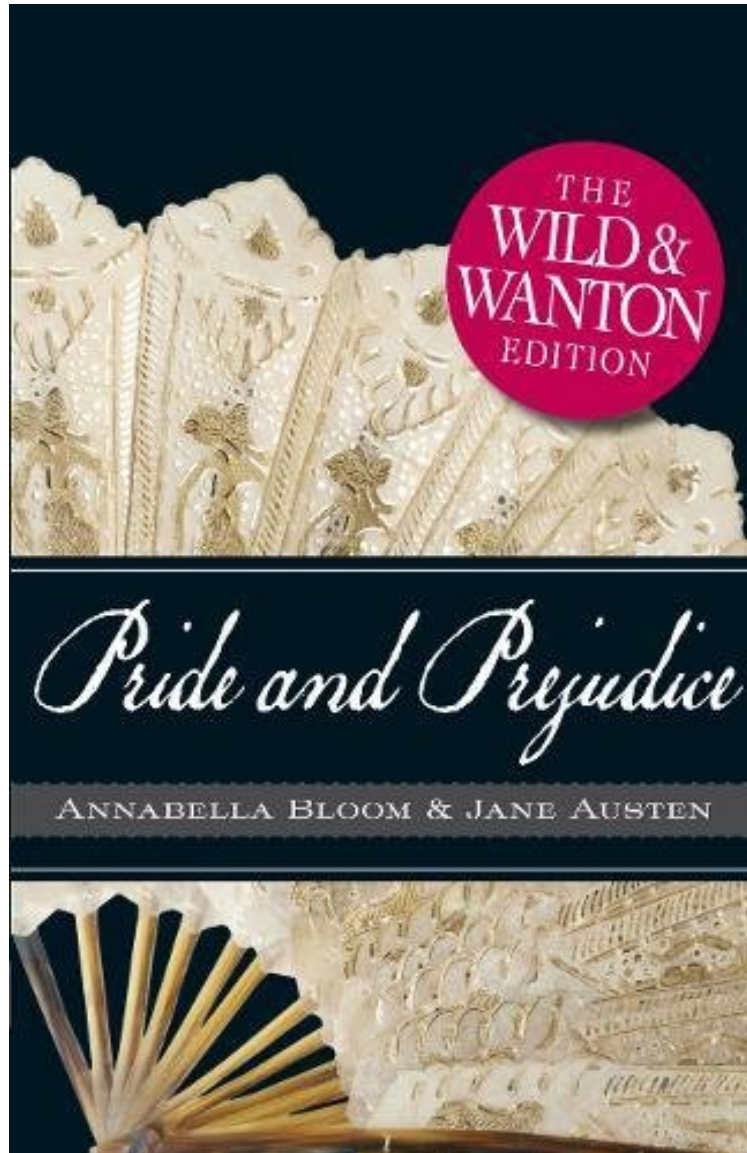

Of course, much of that did still come from Austen's words because this book is a mashup - *PridePrejudice* taken apart, some scenes deleted, new ones inserted and a handful rewritten. Lydia is the most different character, going from excessively silly and self-indulgent to being a exceedingly lucky

light-skirt. How she escapes pregnancy is an entirely unanswered question! Lizzy and Jane felt fairly close to character and much of Lizzy's fantasizing fits fairly nicely with Austen's depictions. It also gives a different perspective on Lizzy's change of heart towards Darcy. The sex scenes were mild as such things go but there was no fade-to-black moments. Whether or not someone likes such scenes is generally a question of personal taste and as such, it is hard to advise. I enjoyed them, but as with all my reactions to this book, it was a mild enjoyment. There were a few annoying points where the author betrayed less competence with the English language than she should have, all of which should have been caught by a good editor. Compromised and compensated are similar in sound but mean very different things! Don't miss the mashup description - this is not an original work. With that in mind, the characterisations do of course feel much closer to the original since so much of it -is- the original. (Exception: Lydia, as mentioned above.) Better than the original, Not that I liked that...By Miss. S When I sat down to read Jane Austen's "Pride and prejudice" I got two thirds of the way through before stopping. Not because I couldn't appreciate the literary merits, but simply because I found it very difficult to feel any real passion or intensity in the proposed 'attachment' of Darcy and Elizabeth. In this 'Wild and Wanton' edition, I very much enjoyed some parts (i.e. small adjustments made by the author, like added prose direction, speech descriptives etc.) In particular, I felt the bond between Elizabeth and Jane more profoundly than the original, which I was very happy with. HOWEVER, (and it's a big 'however') I found that the sexual parts of the book were (for me) sometimes very awkwardly placed, particularly (SPOILER ALERT!) the final scene before marriage with D E. All together, I would rate this book 3/5. Because I liked it better than the original, but I didn't like the original AT ALL. (No offense meant for all of you Jane Austen fans (I just much prefer the Brontes. Jane Eyre, now THERE I felt passion, if the author comes out with a 'Wild and Wanton' Edtn.
