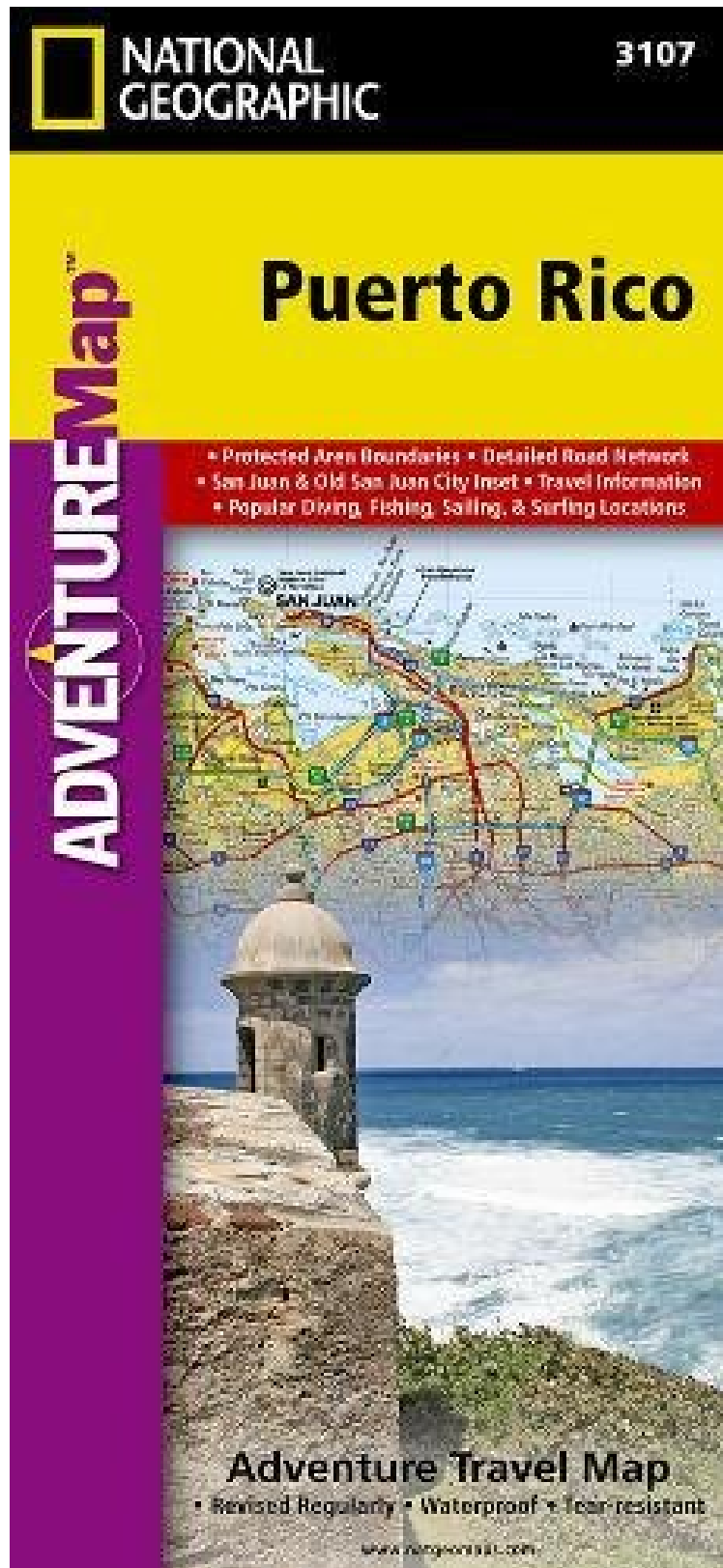

Even then, it's wrong. I'll give 2 huge examples. This map shows a non-existent freeway from Adjuntas to Utuado--in reality, the slow twisty road PR-123 has one slow lane in each direction (and you'll get stuck behind a truck driving 10 mph). In Ceiba, National Geographic shows the Roosevelt Roads navy base--which closed thirteen years ago. Its runway has been converted to Jos Aponte airport.National Geographic has forgotten to update this old map.3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. This covers all the major highways, freeways, roads and includes the entire island. Very fine map, but some of the roads are wrongBy James PernikoffWhile not intended as purely a road map, the large size, larger than all other available maps, will make it useful for that purpose. Unfortunately, a number of routes are wrongly depicted as controlled access highways, which can lead someone onto an inferior road that he or she was not expecting. This includes route 2 (Hatillo to San German), route 3 (Canovanas to Fajardo, and Yabucoa to Guayama) and route 10 (in its entirety). I hope that the good folks at the Geographic correct these errors in their next edition.
