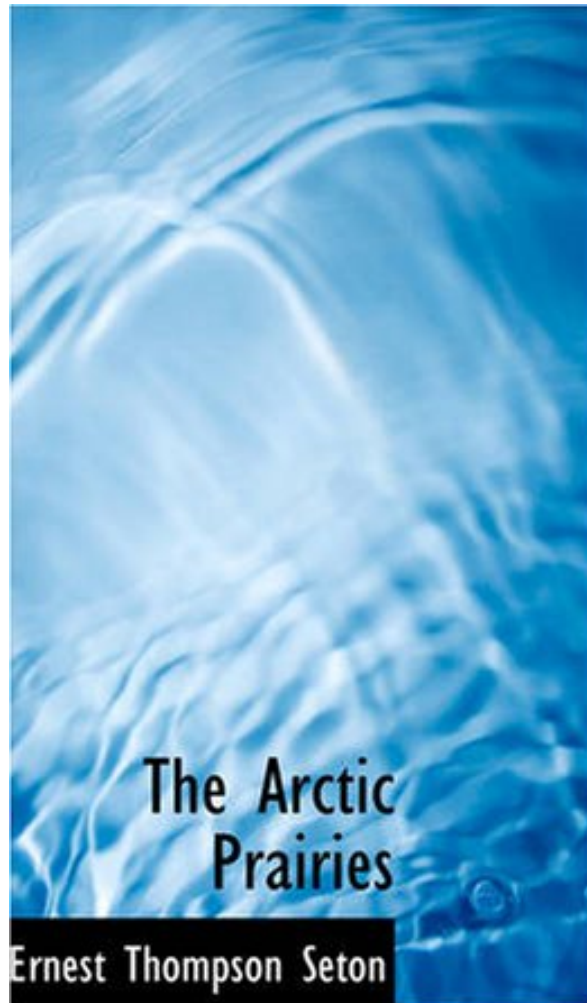

This review is for the HardPress edition. First, I would like to say that Seton's book, "The Arctic Prairies," is a gem. The author is probably best known as a naturalist, but he got his start as an artist. He illustrated all of his books with his incomparable pen and ink drawings and sketches as well as his paintings and photography. Unfortunately, HardPress Publishing has omitted ALL of the artwork and illustrations. This edition has no illustrations, no table of contents, none of Seton's appendices, and in fact nothing but text. The only good thing about this purchase was that I found 's return procedure is simple and efficient. I returned this book and was given a full refund. In summary, HardPress Publishing has totally eviscerated a wonderful old classic of wilderness travel.
