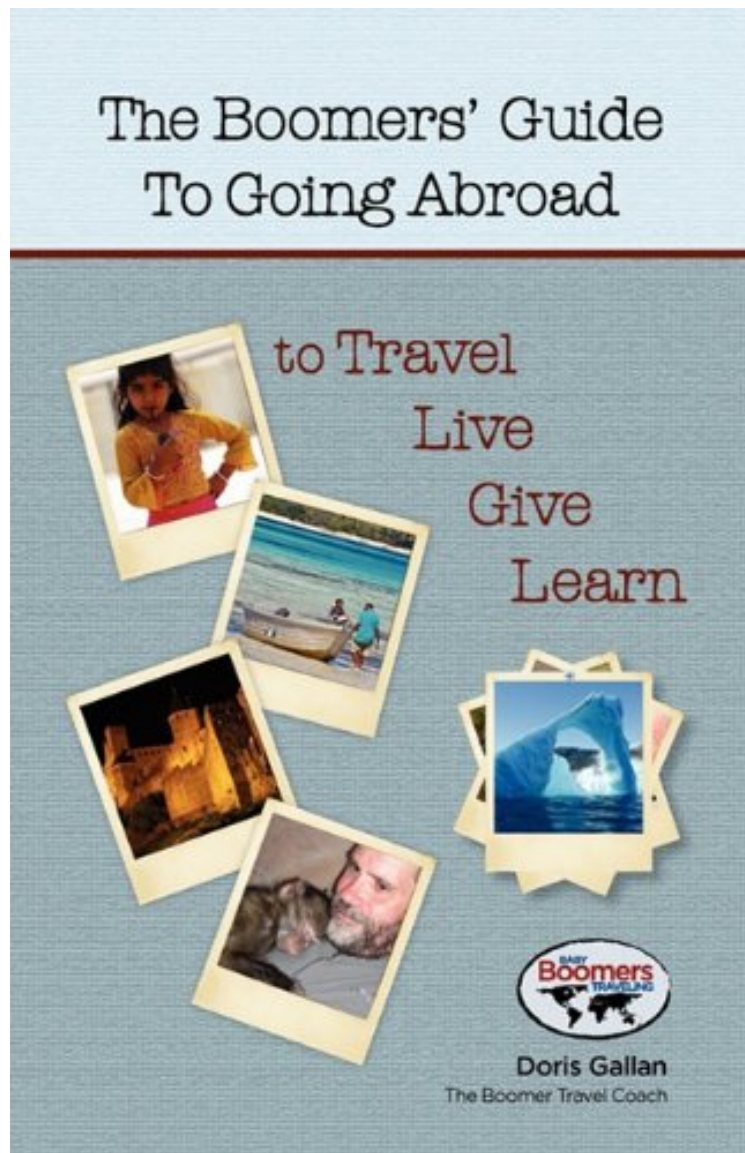


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The Boomers' Guide to Going Abroad to Travel - Live - Give - Learn
